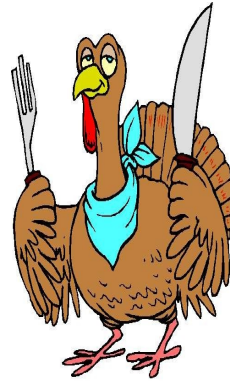

2. VOMCA Treasures Report:

 - a. Since we started, 75 boxes of food and \$110 have been collected for donation to NCEON. Chris Szverra is still accepting donations at her house.
7. Food Pantry at Park: The Food Pantry is being put to good use. We are requesting anyone that is able to help us keep an eye on it and keep it stocked for those in need.
8. Tree Lighting Event: The Tree Lighting Event is scheduled for December 12. Currently the plan is to hold the event from 2-6 PM, with the tree lighting happening at the end of the event. We are still working out social distancing issues with having Santa Claus present and what activities we can hold at the event.

New Business:

1. Budgets for 2021:
 - a. VOMCA: We anticipate no significant changes to the VOMCA budget from the 2020 budget.
 - b. OMSC: Due to unforeseen expenses and reduced income flow this year, there may be some changes to the OMSC budget for 2021. Any changes will be discussed at the OMSC Board meeting later this month.

Welcome everyone to the 2020 HOLIDAY SEASON!

I know that sounds strange, but it has been a strange year. FOOM volunteers are still showing up and doing some maintenance and beautification of the park however we have no group days or large projects and events scheduled at the park for the rest of the year. If you would like to help, please contact me and I can show you some simple tasks we need done. In fact there are less than 12 volunteers who do 95% of the work at the park and we would love to meet some new people, if you are willing to clip, trim, paint, plant, build, or cook the hotdogs we can use you.

The concerns this year have affected our ability to hold events and to raise funds for the park, it has also limited the ability of our normal volunteers to get as much done at the park as we would like. We did finally hold the 2020 Barlowe Bolt this month just 7 months late but I want to thank everyone who worked the event and participated in it, we put in place significant procedures and devices to keep everyone socially distanced and protected so they could enjoy the event. We plan to hold the 2021 Barlowe Bolt on schedule on Saturday March 27th, race starts at 7am, come and join us, setup starts at 5am.

I would like to acknowledge the Lescallett family, they just moved out of our community to pursue an adventure in another state, but while they were here they chose to get involved and helped us create a new FOOM logo and Stephan was also leading an effort to rededicate the playground at Barlowe Field in the name of a member of his unit that had passed away. Like many things Covid delayed that effort however we want to try to move it forward and finish what Stephan started. Chris Szverra and I inspected a playground set up that the county is removing at Lock Haven park in Edgewater, it could use a coat of paint to freshen it up but it consists of a climbing and sliding assembly, a teeter-totter, a swing set similar to what we already have and have been looking to add to, plus 3 benches. We can take the whole thing at no charge but we have to remove it in about 30 days, this will require significant disassembly and pulling some posts out of the ground (with a piece of mechanical equipment) then we can store it until we can install all or selected parts into our park. We think it can be a great addition but will require a lot of volunteers on one day to do the work to remove it. I am looking for someone who might have access to a flatbed truck, and someone who might be able to supply and drive the power equipment. Stephan had started a go fund me page to obtain donations to cover expected costs of the project.

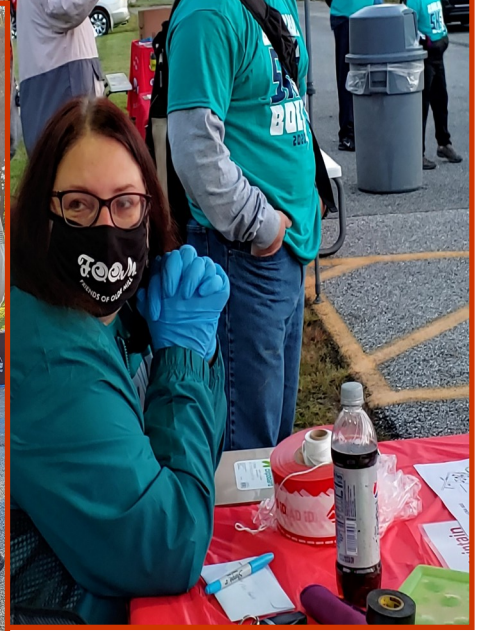
