County 3-1-1

AA County has launched a 3-1-1 Customer Service Program as of April 4, 2017. It is to make service more efficient and responsive. You can dial 3-1-1 for all municipal services, trash, water, etc., from 8a.m. to 4.30.p.m. Monday through Friday. Dial 911 for all emergencies.

You can also download the mobile app through the App Store (iPhone) and Google Play (Android). Just hit the magnifying glass and search for "Arundel 311". Using mobile device, you can take a picture, set a location and receive updates in response to your issue. You can report a lost pet, a pothole and missed trash collection, etc.on your cell.

Comment: It is a nice service; I have tried it. You don't have to worry about phone numbers and the Operators help you determine what department you need.

Snyder Wade Development

The development at the end of Old Mill Blvd and Oakwood Rd. that has been in process for at least 14 years, has signed the papers to begin the grading process for the project. Included in this issue is a copy of the Proposed Pavement Marking Plan for Old Mill Blvd., Oakwood Rd. and the new road from the Snyder Wade Development, Amber Beacon Way. Page 5. No start date has been given.

The County has stated that they will monitor the success of the plan as the project proceeds.



PUBLIC MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT MEETING LOCATION CHANGE

Elvaton Road Culvert Replacement and Temporary Road Closure

WHO:	The Anne Arundel County	Department of Public Works
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- WHAT: Elvaton Road Culvert Replacement and Road Closure Public Meeting
- WHEN: Tuesday, May 9, 2017 6:30 p.m.
- WHERE: Old Mill Middle School North Media Center 610 Patriot Lane Millersville, MD 21108

Due to unforeseen circumstances, the public meeting scheduled for May 9, 2017 to discuss the upcoming Elvaton Road Culvert Replacement and required road closure will now be held at **Old Mill Middle School North**.

The Infrastructure Management Division (IMD) has provided temporary replacement culverts in an effort to ensure roadway safety due to the condition of the existing culverts. This was necessary to provide adequate time to schedule the road closure for after school is completed this year. The ultimate culvert replacement will address flooding due to culvert capacity as well as stabilize the outfall which is currently undermining the roadway embankment. A full culvert replacement of this size cannot effectively be performed in the safest manner possible without a full closure of the roadway. A full closure will help to maintain vehicular safety during construction and allow the contractor to complete the much-needed work as soon as possible. The closure is expected for approximately 8 weeks.

DPW officials will present plans for the construction and detour during the meeting. Presenters at the meeting will also answer questions from those attending.

- Brush/branches must be placed in container or bundled and tied with twine.
- Yard waste should not include cardboard.
- Bags/containers/bundles may not weigh more than 40 lbs each. Tree limbs and branches must be less than 4 ft in length, with max branch diameter of 4 inches.
- No wire or metal ties to secure bags.

Composting Your Yard Waste

Homeowners can reduce the amount of yard waste by composting. Composting is a natural process that turns organic matter into an excellent soil supplement. Benefits of composting include.

Preventing useful material from your yard and kitchen from being wasted in a landfill.

Reducing amount of material being landfilled.

Reducing yard work and the expense of store bought soils and fertilizers

Enhancing the growth of flowers, vegetables, shrubs, and houseplants.

Replacing nutrients in the soil, improves moisture retention, moderates temperatures, controls weeds, and decreases soil erosion.

Anne Arundel County collects and composts yard waste to keep this valuable resource from taking up much-needed space at the County's Landfill.

May 27th Memorial Day Service Flag Placement at Crownsville sponsored by Boy Scouts of The Capitol District.

The ceremony is Saturday, May 27th and starts at 8 am. Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts, Girl Scouts, Ventures as well as participants from other organizations will place flags starting at 8:30am after the memorial service. Guest speakers include a local politician, Daughters of the American Revolution and various Veterans groups.

It is "extremely" important that attendees do not park on Sunrise Beach Road. The county police do not want us parking on the main street. And they may give tickets to those that do.

Safety is our first concern. That is a main road and we do not want anyone to get hurt.

There is plenty of parking inside the cemetery and no one will get blocked in. Placing flags only takes a matter of 15 minutes and scouters will be departing at different times. There will not be any backup leaving the cemetery.

The gates "will not open" before 730 am. That is the cemetery requirement. We have to wait for their staff to be in place before we enter.

The gates for the Cemetery do not open until 0730. We start the Ceremony promptly at 0800 with the invocation. There is plenty of time to park and get to the ceremony before it starts.

At 0830 we will start placing the Flags.

The Cemetery is located on Sunrise Beach Rd. in Crownsville.

A change this year is that there will not be any refreshments. We ask that leaders insure their scouts bring their individual water containers and any snacks they may need.






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Become a Street Ambassador!

Did you know there are 1,300 homes in the Village of Olde Mill? Friends of Olde Mill (FOOM) needs more community members to join us! We are a non-profit community group comprised completely of fellow homeowners who seek to make improvements to Barlowe Field, the playscape, and organize community events!

Here are some of the events that we have organized:

The Barlowe Bolt 5K Community Flea Market Family Fun Day Quarter Auctions

What does a street ambassador do? Hand out flyers to neighbors, talk to neighbors about upcoming events, pass out water bottles and organize bags for runners at our 5K, greet guests at our events, garner items for our flea market table, sell hot dogs at our Family Fun Day, work a game station on Family Fun Day, assist at our events, provide feedback, spread the word about Community Build Day, solicit for volunteers at events, assist us in finding and applying for grants, etc.

What is the time commitment for street ambassadors? Most months it might be about an hour of your time just talking to neighbors or passing out flyers on your street. If you decide to help with an event or two it might be a couple other hours either leading up to the event or on the day of the event.

SUMMARY of CORPORAL MacAdoo's REMARKS

This summary is from the March 1, VOMCA meeting.

Corporal McAdoo from the AACo Police Department was our guest speaker last night to pass on reminders of how to help keep us safe...most are common sense and suggestions we've heard before, but always worth a reminder...

His biggest message was "If you see something, say something!" As we make phone calls to the police and they come out they can start to watch for 'trends' in our community, request police conduct additional drives thru our community to heighten the police presence, and potentially have police sitting in areas where we have a lot of traffic (like at Barlowe Field) while they are working on reports. Making phone calls and having the police come out will also help them learn who some of our "repeat" offenders are and after a couple times of asking the offenders to move on or whatever the police can then say 'you've been warned more than once, now we are taking action'.

Not sure what numbers to call: If it is an emergency call 911 Non-emergency number 410-222-8610 Eastern District station number 410-222-6145

He said most vehicle thefts are people with addiction issues looking for quick money or items they can quickly/easily sell for money...they are going thru checking car doors looking for doors that are unlocked. So, his suggestions were:

1. Lock your vehicles and secure your valuables (don't leave items out in your vehicle that people can see).

2. Leave outside lights on.

3. Consider adding surveillance cameras to your house. They have really come down in price, are easy to use and install and then you could have a video image of the offender that you can share with the police and then they share that image with all the police and possibly on their fb page looking for leads.

4. Follow AACo police on fb

Did you know there is a traffic car coordinator who deals with concerns on people speeding and running stop signs and drivers who don't stop behind busses. Call Eastern District and ask for the traffic car coordinator and express your concerns.

Obviously the more details you can provide when calling in a report the better. He said most people now days have cell phones...snap a picture of the offender, vehicle, license plate, etc.

He also mentioned that the police love being out in the communities meeting parents and children. He did comment on how he quite often over hears parents telling children, 'oh, there's a police officer, you better be good' he said by saying that we are giving our children the impression that the police are the bad guys and would rather we introduce ourselves and our children to them so our children can see the police as good guys and not bad guys.

Here's to working as a community to help keep us and our families safe!
