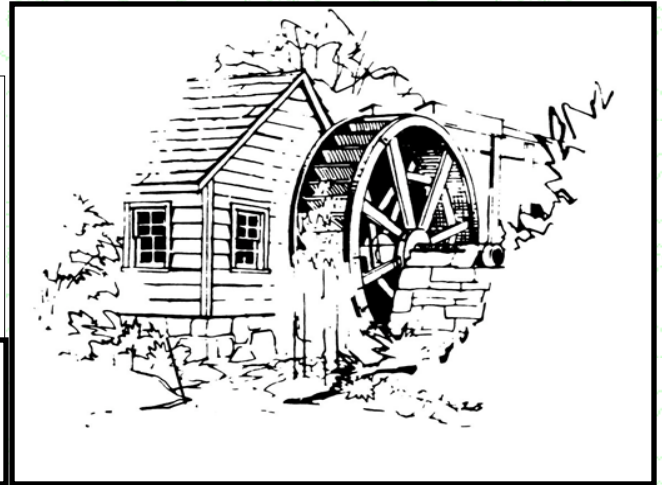

Lets make this a safe and successful year for all.

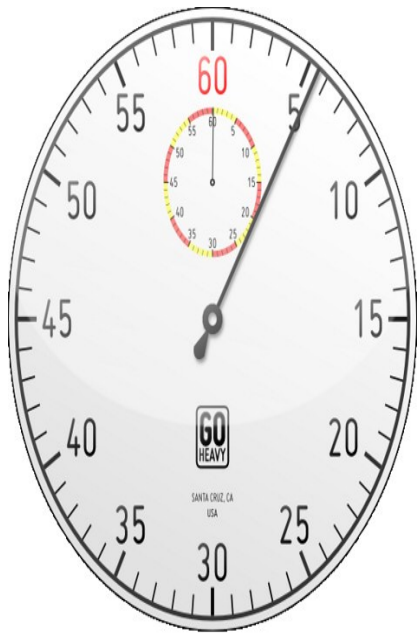

THE MINUTES

The August 2nd VOMCA meeting was held at Sandy Sacra's home, due to rain. There were 7 members present and 1 non-member. Thank you to Sandy for volunteering her home for the meeting.

President Bev Parker started the meeting by discussing the Olde Mill Swim Club Pool. Issues included repairs to the pool, Member ship fees and the possible need for a swim club Committee. A youth party was scheduled for August. Problems with Continental Pool Management were discussed. President Parker proposed we cancel the 2 year contract and find another company.

Issues include pool being dirty, trash not being removed, bathrooms not cleaned and non-enforcement of club rules. The Board voted to cancel the contract at the end of the swim season. New companies will be interviewed.

Treasurer, Paul Shafer reported Swim Club checking at \$68,247.34, and savings at \$12,082.28.

Barb Mason was confirmed as Vice President of VOMCA.

A suggestion by Paul Shafer was made to turn Olde Mill into a Home Owners Association to help with the lack of money to maintain the Pool and Barlowe Field. Due to the original documents that Established the Community Association, it would be hard to mandate.

Reminder that FOOM is sponsoring a Quarter Auction for the Playground on Oct. 13, 2017 at the American Legion Hall in Severn. (See flyer in this issue.)
Meeting was adjourned at 9pm.
