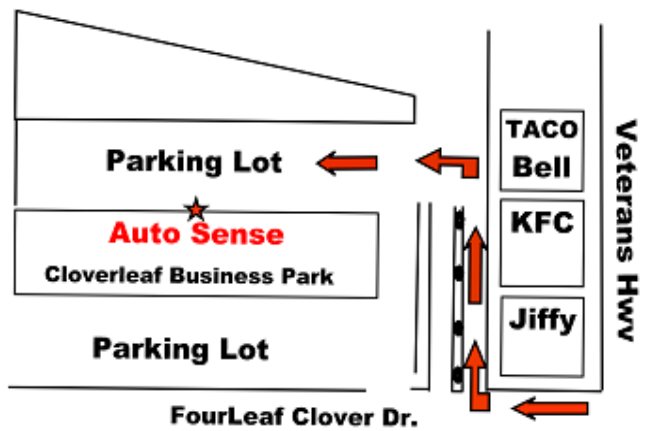

County Executive Steve Schuh Announces Proposal to End Veteran Homelessness in Anne Arundel County

\$80,000 “Operation Home” Would Take Homeless Off the Streets

Annapolis, MD (April 30, 2018) –County Executive Steve Schuh today announced his FY2019 budget proposal will fund "Operation Home," an \$80,000 effort to end veteran homelessness in Anne Arundel County.

“No one who has served our nation should ever end up on the streets,” said Schuh. “‘Operation Home’ is our effort to ensure we can put a roof over the head of every homeless veteran in Anne Arundel County.”

According to the most recent estimates, a total of 25 homeless veterans were identified in the County, including 12 in shelters, five in transitional housing, and eight residing on the street. Currently, it is estimated that the 15 homeless veterans residing on the street or in a shelter are in need of permanent supportive housing due to disabilities, mental health issues, or other health issues which prevent them from living independently.

“Launching this initiative is just the momentum we need to get us to the finish line and end veterans’ homelessness for good here in our County,” Kathleen Koch, the Executive Director for Arundel Community Development Services, Inc. "I am pleased the County Executive is providing this support and enabling ACDS and its many partners to work toward this significant goal.”

The proposal would make services available for these individuals, with an additional \$60,000 in County funds and an additional \$20,000 in HOME funds for the program in the FY2019 budget.

For citizens interested in helping in the County’s effort, ACDS has created a fundraising campaign to leverage these government funds, allowing them to house veterans at a quicker pace and to provide the critically needed supportive services and case management for homeless veterans. The County Executive will formally include the funding in his FY2019 budget on May 1st. The proposal is subject to County Council approval.

SUMMARY of AA Police CORPORAL MacAdoo's REMARKS

Meeting Notes from April 2017

Corporal MacAdoo from the AACo Police Department was our guest speaker last night to pass on reminders of how to help keep us safe...most are common sense and suggestions we've heard before, but always worth a reminder...

His biggest message was **"If you see something, say something!"** As we make phone calls to the police and they come out, they can start to watch for 'trends' in our community, request police conduct additional drives thru our community to heighten the police presence, and potentially have police sitting in areas where we have a lot of traffic (like at Barlowe Field) while they are working on reports. Making phone calls and having the police come out will also help them learn who some of our "repeat" offenders are and after a couple times of asking the offenders to move on or whatever, the police can then say 'you've been warned more than once, now we are taking action'.

Not sure what numbers to call:

If it is an emergency call 911

Non-emergency number 410-222-8610

Eastern District station number 410-222-6145



He said most vehicle thefts are people with addiction issues looking for quick money or items they can quickly/easily sell for money...they are going thru checking car doors looking for doors that are unlocked. So, his suggestions were:

1. Lock your vehicles and secure your valuables (don't leave items out in your vehicle that people can see).
2. Leave outside lights on.
3. Consider adding surveillance cameras to your house. They have really come down in price, are easy to use and install and then you could have a video image of the offender that you can share with the police and then they share that image with all the police and possibly on their fb page looking for leads.
4. Follow AACo police on fb

Did you know there is a **traffic car coordinator who deals with concerns with people speeding and running stop signs** and drivers who don't stop behind busses. Call Eastern District and ask for the traffic car coordinator and express your concerns.

Obviously the more details you can provide when calling in a report the better. He said most people now a days have cell phones...snap a picture of the offender, vehicle, etc.

He also mentioned that the police love being out in the communities meeting parents and children. He did comment on how he quite often over hears parents telling children, 'oh, there's a police officer, you better be good' he said by saying that we are giving our children the impression that the police are the bad guys. They would rather we introduce ourselves and our children to them so our children can see the police as good guys and not bad guys.

Here's to working as a community to help keep us and our families safe!
