

January Meeting Minutes

January 2nd, 2019

We were locked out to start the new year! The meeting was called to order around 7:12 pm in the lobby of the Old Mill School Complex. (We later moved into Rm A272.)

In attendance were Chris Szverra, President; Randal Stites, Vice President; Chris Hilton, Treasurer; Reese Szverra, Secretary; Paul Shaffer, Board Member; Sarah Hakulin, Board Member; Marc Mason, community member; John Mason, community member; Lianne Rostad, VOMCA member; Wendy Anservits, VOMCA member; Marshall Anservits, VOMCA member; Megan Greenwell, VOMCA member; Lisa England, VOMCA member; Ken England, VOMCA member; and Mary Stites, VOMCA member.

Chris Szverra introduced herself as the new president for the coming year. She explained that we are looking for a new meeting place because the school has not been dependable. We have the room in the building now from 7 to 9 pm to give more time for discussion and to get to know our neighbors who come to meetings.

Chris Szverra gave the treasurer's report. The VOMCA checking acct has \$1904.33. The savings acct has \$1588.73. Paul Shaffer gave the OMSC treasurer's report. Their savings acct has \$35,107.91; checking has \$24,795.78. The VOMCA report shows 25 members currently [with 2 more joining at the meeting (27)].

Randal gave the FOOM Snack Shack repair update. There was no update...however, he told what the plans were for the Shack. These include clean up and paint; lights replaced; refrigerator; fix hot water problem; organize storage and kitchen areas; restroom touch up. Also, he told us that permits are not needed to sell anything closed and that the Shack would be able to be used for any event on the field, pool, or park areas.

We went through the packet that Chris Szverra gave us. There was a flyer for Ledo's pizza night on Jan. 31st from 11 am to 10 pm. We are encouraged to pass the flyer on and talk it up because our organization will get 20% of the profits if people say they are with VOMCA.

There was a calendar of events in the packet, including the Egg Hunt, Family Fun Day, Tree Lighting, and Fall Fest. These are all events held by FOOM last year, but should be VOMCA events. They are items on the budget as well.

We are going to have a membership drive. Ideas about advertising will be discussed at a future meeting.

New Business – January Minutes continued....

The FOOM/VOMCA Connection was discussed.

Before anything else was said, it was made clear that FOOM is a separate organization with their own budget responsible for the park/field building and maintenance. We are sister organizations, however. They are fixing the Snack Shack and gifting those repairs - including the time, money, and services - to VOMCA.

Pool Budget – prepared by Chris S., Paul (Treasurer of OMSC), Randal, and Sarah

The differences in the budget between 2018 and 2019 are because actual figures from 2018 were used to predict the 2019 expenses and income.

There were questions about what management fees include, which were answered nicely by Marc Mason, who works with the company who handles the management of OMSC. While we don't have a copy of the management contract yet, one is on its way. The management company, as far as we know, handles the lifeguards and managers, maintenance of chemicals, lifeguard insurance, (having a diving board costs extra,) provide chlorine and pH chemicals. The supervising team for the pool is also provided by the company. An additional chemical is used by Kevin Kendall due to the age of the pool. This chemical is NOT provided by the management company, so it is provided for in the budget under "Operating Other (chemicals...)". The hospitality amount is budgeted to pay lifeguards for events after regular business hours, but only for community or school events. Private events lifeguards are paid for by the patron. The change in the amusement tax is due to it being based on a percentage of sales (10%). Therefore, since the number of parties decreased last year, so did the amount budgeted to cover this tax.

Barlowe Field maintenance and lawn mowing – This proposal is due to be signed before Feb. 1st, 2019. The Board will be looking around to see if we can get the service cheaper and if it can include the pool area which is being covered by volunteers right now.

Dues for pool – It was proposed that the dues go up again this year, but most people thought that it should remain the same. After a long discussion we voted that they would remain the same for this year to focus on membership, with the discussion to raise the dues to be discussed again next year.

Reese motioned to approve the budget. Meghan seconded. The vote was unanimous to approve the budget.

VOMCA budget – It was generally agreed upon that the tax prep item seemed high. However, we have no idea if it's high for the service we get or not. This, like all the things we pay money for, will be investigated as we move forward. We want to make sure that we are getting the best

service for our money and that we are not overpaying for anything.

Discussed the discretionary (President's) fund. Why did it go up? There were specific incidents that prompted this change, and based on those figures, it was decided that the fund should be \$200 (up from \$100 last year). The bi-laws support the change as long as it's voted on.

Reese motioned to approve the budget. Marshall seconded. The vote was unanimous to pass the budget.

(It was mentioned that the community members want to make sure that no pool money is going to VOMCA to pay for anything when there are so many repairs that need to be made to the pool. We all agree that this is very important, so we discussed how the use of the President's fund needed to be voted on before the money could be used for anything at all. The president cannot use the money without Board approval with a formal vote. The point of the fund is to have money available for unexpected expenses without affecting the budget. It is also for VOMCA expenses only.

Randal motioned to adjourn the meeting. Meghan seconded. The meeting was adjourned at 8:52pm.
