#### MARCH MEETING MINUTES

#### MARCH 6, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:12 p.m. In attendance was Chris Szverra, President; Nancy Stracke, member; Sarah Hakulin, member; Alison Lombel, member; Brian Lombel, member; Lisa England, member; Megan Greenwell, member; Randal Stites, Vice President; Chris Hilton, Treasurer; Mary Stites, member; Sandy Sacra, Membership Specialist; Reese Szverra, Secretary; and Lianne Rostad, member.

The Treasurer reported that the checking account had \$2783.12, and the savings account had \$1589.00 in funds. The membership report showed 51-member households.

Chris and Randal met with Sean Price, who is the liaison for American Pool, at the OMSC on 3/5/19. The quote for the pool repairs is \$136,000. The American Pool Company has merged with Community Pools, and Mr. Price will be bringing his current engineers in to give us a 5-year plan to break down the needed work by price and importance. This will allow us to chunk the work so that it will be more affordable. It should also prevent us from having to close the pool down for any one season to do repairs on the pool.

This led to a discussion about fundraising. John Mason sent in a proposal for ways that we could make money to fix the pool using the pool itself. We briefly discussed these but will go into detail at the April meeting.

Rick Behringer is going away, and he left a list of work that needs to be done for the pool to open. American Pool Company will do some of the repairs, like caulking. Kevin Kendall sent a packet to Chris as well. FOOM has offered to do some of the work also. Thanks for all the time and work you both have given to the pool

Nancy Stracke asked if we could request donations from local medical professionals, like Dr. Valley. Donations to VOMCA are NOT tax deductible. Donations to FOOM are tax deductible. This may affect who is asked for donations.

The discussion went back to work on the pool. A white coat is the first project needed. Some underlying work needs to be done to open this year. The pool company should do the coping stones. The pool was redone by Community Pools in 1993. Sean Price, from American Pools, is willing to come to a meeting and talk to us once they know more about the work needed.



Rick's list consisted of things like painting the diving board and lifeguard chairs, cutting and weeding grass, power washing everything. Paul and Randal have offered to do some of this work. EL Landscaping was asked about the grass. They are already signed for this season.

The pool opens at the end of May. We talked about doing away with the bond again. Kevin Kendall said he would quit if we did that. We are continuing discussions about a compromise, like reducing the bond to \$200 or accepting payment plans for the cost. Nothing was decided.

An email was sent to the Girl Scouts about helping hide the eggs for the Easter Egg Hunt. We need about 8-10 big bags of candy. There are 2000 eggs. Donations can be dropped off to 8263 Mimico North. We are also collecting clean 2-Liter bottles and tall Pringles cans.



We discussed fundraisers. A candy sale will take place soon. We would make 50% of the profit.

A Tupperware sale/party will take place in April. (Since the meeting, this has been set up for April 7<sup>th</sup> at 1 pm at 8263 Mimico North.) We will make 40% on the fundraising catalog items and 20% on the regular catalog items. This will be a party and an online sale.

"Mary and Martha" was a fundraising idea mentioned by Nancy Stracke.

We discussed that we need to make more money per fundraiser. We talked about banners that companies could buy an advertisement and it could hang on the pool fence for the season.

Randal is going to do a mulch sale. This could generate amazing revenue once we get it going. He wants to do a test season, where we sell the mulch and then hand deliver it to houses in the morning. He wants to do this within the month of March. (Since the meeting, this sale has been put together. It will last until April 6<sup>th</sup> with delivery being on April 13<sup>th</sup> by Randal. We discussed all of the places that we could get mulch, i. e., Richardson's Nursery, Evergreen Gene's, Homestead Gardens, etc.

We discussed a possible rummage sale, a GoFund Me, and advertisements in the Crier.

SPRF has equipment for us to pick up. Contact Pauline.

It was also discussed that we should use door hanger bags for the Crier deliveries. This would prevent problems with the pages getting wet. Everyone thinks it's a good idea to go back to paper Criers to be delivered to every house in Olde Mill.

At 8:52, Lisa England motioned to adjourn the meeting. Sarah Hakulin seconded the motion. We adjourned at 8:52 p.m.




