

The corner sign says 10 mph around the turn but wait there's a "Yield", What do I do? Where is the on-coming traffic coming from that I am merging into? Oh wait, I am on-coming traffic, aren't I?









We now have mass confusion with 2 Stop signs and a new Yield(?) sign...

What we should suggest is putting up a "No Left Turn" sign under the stop sign, see suggestion. In addition, add a "Right Turn Permitted Without Stopping" sign on the stop sign for the lane that is on Oakwood Rd see suggestion below and example to the right. Then remove the "Yield" and second "Stop" sign.

Suggestion: Add a "No Left Turn" sign to prevent head on collisions.

Work Day was July 20th however the temperatures for that day reached over 100 degrees. The food service of this event was cancelled but as well as the day, but 8 workers showed up anyway and did some major work on the restrooms and kitchen area of the snack shack. FAA to Reconsider

BWI Airport Flight Noise

The Federal Aviation Administration will reconsider its position challenging Maryland over new flight patterns and the noise they bring residents living near BWI Thurgood Marshall Airport.

The FAA filed a motion Tuesday to hold Md's case in abeyance while it reconsiders.

In September(2018), the FAA wrote a letter to the state declining to respond to a petition asking for more review of the flight patterns.

Maryland Attorney Brian Frosh says he's hopeful the FAA will undertake a review of the facts and ultimately lead to changes in flight paths. Gov. Larry Hogan says his administration remains committed to restoring the quality of life for residents around the state's airports.
