

#### **August VOMCA Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was held on August 7th, 2019, at 7:00 pm at Wendy's on Veteran's Hwy. We started at 7:05 pm. In attendance were Reese Szverra, Mackenzie Simmons, Chris Szverra, Lisa England, Chris and Kristin Steelman, Jim Sacra, Sandy Sacra, Sarah Hakulin, Paul Shaffer, Marc Mason, Charlotte Rader, Cpl. Scott McAdoo, Chris Hilton, and Rick Haynesworth. All are members except Mr. and Mrs. Steelman and Cpl. McAdoo.

The treasurer's report as of 8/1 is as follows: in checking; \$2,744.15; savings, \$1589.64.

The Swim Club treasurer's report as of 8/1 is as follows: checking, \$49,148.97; savings,

The membership report is as follows: VOMCA, 63 households; swim club memberships, 159 active, including 12 new and 9 transfers, and 42 inactive.

There was a correction needed to the July minutes. The balance for the swim club checking account was listed as \$5720; it should have been \$57, 207.83. A motion to accept the minutes from the July meeting with this correction was made by Chris Szverra and seconded by Sandy Sacra. The motion passed unanimously to accept the minutes from the July meeting with the correction.

Ledo's fundraiser will be held on 8/14. Come out and support VOMCA!

The Fall Fest will be held October 26th. We need clothes to make scarecrows! Toddler clothes are preferred. Drop offs can be made to Reese Szverra at 8263 Mimico North. Please contact anyone from VOMCA to set this off or just leave a bag on the porch! Thank you for supporting this event!

The Quarter Auction will be held in November. We are looking for donations and participants! Come out and help!

Someone used the Click Report to anonymously report VOMCA and FOOM for work they believed was being done without the proper permits. An inspector came out and we are happy to report that no problems were found with the work that has been done in the pool/playground/ snack shack areas. Thank you to Randal Stites who took the day off of work to meet with the inspector. The field and snack shack were both thoroughly checked, and only a plumber was needed for a job that hadn't been completed yet. There were NO violations found and a permit is on the way for the pipe that needs a plumber.

Chris and Kristin Steelman were at the meeting to talk to us about the RWES car show that they ran at OMHS. They told us how much they spent, what sort of time period we needed for planning, how much space we needed, etc. We also talked about the contract for vehicle owners. They offered to answer any other questions that anyone has and left a phone number where they can be contacted.

We were joined by Cpl. Scott McAdoo from the Anne Arundel County Police Community Relations Council. He is the community outreach officer for the eastern district and the liason for PACT - Police and Community Together. He shared a lot of information with us about the police presence in our neighborhood and the crime stats for the community. He shared that the staffing is really thin, with only about 3 officers patrolling at any one time. He also shared the non-emergency phone number: 410-222-8610. You can call this num-

ber and remain anonymous to report anything you see that might need checking out. His phrase: If you see something, say something!

Because staffing is so thin, Cpl. McAdoo emphasized how much of a difference the community members can make when it comes to stopping crime. He told us that it's better to say something so that things that look suspicious can be checked out. This can help prevent crime before it happens. For example, theft from autos is common in our area. Most of the time, the doors were left unlocked in the cars which had items stolen. So, secure your valuables, lock your doors, and if you see something, say something! Call the police even if the amount stolen is small. This helps them to track where crime is happening. 80% of all crime is about drugs. If you can reduce drugs, you can reduce all crime. Call the police if you notice something that doesn't seem right.

Cameras help reduce crime also! They are affordable also. Ring doorbell, NEST, animal vision cams, Verizon and Comcast both offer a camera for your property's protection. Ring App is a neighborhood App that is free to use. It only deals with crime and neighborhood issues. No camera is needed. Police are contacted when something is reported there. All users remain anonymous. You can pick the neighborhood that you keep track of. 30,000 people in AA County use this App. For every 20 people who download the App, Ring will donate a camera to the neighborhood. Cpl. McAdoo had one with him to give away. The service is only about \$3 per month or \$30 per year to record on this camera. (Here he gave us a fundraising idea. Thanks for helping us out, Cpl. McAdoo!)

Lights are also very helpful to keep crime down. Motion lights, outdoor lights, indoor lights. He also mentioned that dogs are a great security system!

Security surveys are offered free by the police! This is a home security survey where the police will come to your house to assess where you might need to beef up your precautions. Contact Cpl McAdoo to set one up!

The Police Community Relations Council meets the 3rd Wednesday of every month at 7:30 pm at the AA County police station off Veteran's Hwy. There is always someone there from the Police, a guest speaker, and people to connect with from the community.

The Citizens Police Academy is an opportunity to learn more about what police do. There are several weeks of training with the police, which is free.

Not ready to commit to several weeks? You can go online to request a ride along with the police. However, you should have a good reason to request this service. Police station tours are available as well.

Mobile Crisis hotline is available 24/7 to help with any issues that you may experience. Counsellors will come to your house and talk to you or a family member for free if you find that you have a situation that is out of your control or if you just need someone to talk to for help.

The police also have a program called the Safe Station Program. You can go to any police or fire station with drugs and get help for yourself. You have to come in on your own, and you have to surrender your drugs. About 5 people per day are getting help through this service.

The police headquarters hours are 7:30 am to 4 pm.

They offer prescription drop off and disposal. You can bring any prescriptions you have around the house that you no longer need and you can dispose of them at the station. Needles, syringes, drugs, etc can all be disposed of safely here.

In conclusion, Cpl McAdoo wanted to know how he could help. He wants to hear your concerns and what things you think we need to improve on. (This prompted a discussion about facing the correct direction when you park on the road and about the new traffic pattern that is emerging where Old Mill Rd turns to Oakwood.)

The county police follow the Neighbors App and sometimes, the NextDoor App.

Cpl McAdoo will be joining us for the fall fest! You can come see his patrol car and pick up some information about these awesome programs run by the police department!

The September meeting will be held at Old Mill High School.

There are positions available for next year's officers. A list of who will be running will be in the Crier. Elections are in October.

#### Also in October, we will welcome Councilwoman Pickard!

We discussed American Pools a bit. The Pool Committee meeting will be TBA. There is still one payment left to go for American Pools. There is a lot to discuss about the pool.

The FOOM meeting will be held on 8/15.

The motion to adjourn was made by Reese and seconded by Sandy Sacra.

We adjourned the meeting at 8:55 pm.
