



Pool Update:

We met with American Pool regarding opening this season. They stated that there is no way we can open prior to June 20. They are still working on training up lifeguards to meet the new opening seasons across the area. The pool itself is ready to open. We will not be able to use the wading pool area this season. For this year, children will be allowed to be in the main pool if they are wearing swim diapers; VOMCA/OMSC is planning on trying to provide a supply to be placed at the pool.

We have received an email from American Pool with a list of items that need to be completed prior to the pool opening.

Anticipate a possibility of the situation changing based on policies being put out at the state and county levels.

With the pool opening late, there will be a reduced pay rate for this season's membership. Refunds will be figured for any weeks that the pool is not open this season. Anyone who joins/becomes an active member between now and the end of the season will pay a reduced rate based on the weeks remaining in the season.

Discussion regarding whether we should require members to bring their own chairs or develop a method to clean existing pool chairs for public use.

NCEON Update: We started collecting donations the day after our May meeting. So far, we have collected 23 boxes of food for NCEON. Donations have slowed down over the last week. Decision was made to keep the donations going for now.

New Business:

FOOM Business: Randal is hoping that over the course of the next month we get back into our scheduled events. We would like to try to run the Bolt in September if we have the timers, etc., available. We would also like to do a fall Flea Market and whatever other events we can reasonably do based on the remaining time for the year and existing volunteers.

Discussing Budgets for the rest of the year: Budgets will be discussed over the next months. We must look at our existing income and what programs/projects we can do for the remainder of the year.

Volunteer for Projects at the Pool and Field: We are asking for volunteer help with specific projects:

Weeding of garden areas at Old Mill sign, Chalet Road sign and memorial garden areas.

Help with the memorial garden area near the basketball court Maintaining area behind the north backstop at the ball field Weed cleanup of basketball court area (cracks in court) Securing chain link fencing around basketball court Removal of shade shelters in pool enclosure

Resurfacing Project on Old Mill Rd: At some point this summer, the county is going to be resurfacing Old Mill Road from Kenora Drive to Veteran's Highway. No word yet on exact dates for the resurfacing.

Food Trucks: If we have food trucks operating on VOMCA property (i.e. Barlowe Field parking lot), they will need to provide us with copies of their business insurance and their operating permits as well as an agreement keeping us (VOMCA) from being liable for any incidents that happen involving their operation. They could also park along Chalet Road or Old Mill Road with no connection/liability to VOMCA.

Meeting adjourned at 8:23 pm. Next meeting TBD.



The new reporting tool features an interactive map to help you identify the light's location.






This deer came to visit at Moncton Rd. the 7th of June and For some reason she Saw her picture being Taken and decided to Pose for a snapshot Or two.



Our neighbors are in need, many of them for the first time in their lives. They have been hit with unexpected layoffs and long and frustrating waits for unemployment benefits. They have families and they are facing these things when they were already living on the edge of just making it.

I have always felt a need to feed people. Maybe it's because my mother and father were older when they had me and they both lived through the depression. My mom was the Class of 31 and their prospects were not good. My mother taught me to never let anyone leave my table hungry and if any of you have ever been to anything I have ever had, you know that I listened to my mother. LOL

I taught my Girl Scouts that one person can make a difference. One person can make a change. And I believe that.

So I got a letter from NCEON and they said they are in desperate need of food. They get all their donations from churches, civic organizations and scouting groups. None of them are meeting right now so that supply of food has been slowed to a trickle. And the number of people that they are servicing has increased.

What to do? At our VOMCA meeting I suggested we hold a food drive. No contact. Just let people know that we had a drop off point and that they could leave donations there and I would take them to the pantry. Little did I know how generous you would all be. I am thrilled. NCEON is thrilled. And all those people that you are helping are thrilled.

This is on-going. The box is on my porch at 8263 Mimico North. We all check it several times a day and bring in the food left and box it up and take photos so you can see what you all have done. Once a week, usually Wednesday, I go on my lunch hour and drop it off. They are in need of cereal, peanut butter and jelly, canned fruits and vegetables, canned meats like tuna, spam, beef stew, spaghetti O's, pancake mix and syrup, pasta, and sauces, soups, canned milk, boxed milk, juice boxes, etc. And they take donations of

cash and checks made out to NCEON. So if you'd like to participate, just swing by my house and drop off what you can.




