

Date: August 5, 2020

Location: Conducted at Old Mill Swim Club

The meeting was called to order by Chris Szverra at 7:05. 8 Members and 3 potential new members were

present.

Old Business:

- 1. VOMCA Treasures Report:
 - a. Checking \$1939.35
 - b. Savings: \$1591.15
 - c. Taxes have not been paid. It appears to be an issue with billing and the current situation.
- 2. Swim Club Treasures Report:
 - a. Checking \$9312.10
 - b. Savings \$6222.00
 - c. 160 members: 73 Active, 87 Inactive
 - d. For this year, we are waiving late fees and allowing new members to sign up without penalty and members to pay for their membership fees due to the current situation. There is a reduced rate this year because of the shorter season. Any pool bonds not paid for by the end of the year will be forfeited.
- 3. VOMCA Membership Report: 74 members (10 more than last year)
- 4. Minutes: Discussion, Review and Acceptance: Reviewed and passed unanimously
- 5. NCEON Update:
 - a. Since we started, we have collected 53 boxes of food and \$110 in donations.
 - b. Donations are still being accepted at Chris Szverra's, 8263 Mimico N.
- 6. Food Pantry at Park: A food lending pantry is mounted at the entrance to the OMSC parking lot. This is a free resource to any community members needing extra assistance. Any community members that wish to donate to it are welcome to do so.

New Business:

- 1. FOOM Business:
 - a. Barlowe Bolt has been rescheduled to October 3rd.
 - b. Barlowe Field Community Cleanup is scheduled for September 12.
 - c. Quarter Auction to support FOOM is scheduled for November 14 at the American Legion. Currently anticipate postponing it again until a later date based on the current situation.
- 2. Pool Update:
 - a. A new pump was installed at the pool to replace the aging pump we previously had.
 - b. Annapolis Swim Club is currently renting the pool weekday mornings since their original location is closed down due to the situation. They are requesting to continue renting the pool through at least September.
- 3. Any Other New Business:

Meeting adjourned at 8:11 pm. Next meeting will be September 2, 7 pm, at the Old Mill Swim Club.



We are still battling the invasive and overgrown English Ivy that is damaging our trees in some areas of our woods, we have made great progress this summer but still lost 2 medium sized trees to the weight of the ivy. Come on out and clip a little for us. The teams at FOOM and VOMCA are working very hard to plan for the fall and really focus our limited volunteer abilities on high priority items. We are constantly reviewing and updating the events calendar to bring opportunities to our community while minimizing any risk.

Our next organized effort will be our **Community Improvement Day on September 12**th **starting at 7am**, done and gone by 1pm. 

NEEDS YOUR DONATIONS....PLEASE HELP!

Our neighbors are in need, many of them for the first time in their lives. They have been hit with unexpected layoffs and long and frustrating waits for unemployment benefits. They have families and they are facing these things when they were already living on the edge of just making it.

I have always felt a need to feed people. Maybe it's because my mother and father were older when they had me and they both lived through the depression. My mom was the Class of 31 and their prospects were not good. (Great Depression) My mother taught me to never let anyone leave my table hungry and if any of you have ever been to anything I have ever had, you know that I listened to my mother. LOL

I taught my Girl Scouts that one person can make a difference. One person can make a change. And I believe that.

So I got a letter from NCEON and they said they are in desperate need of food. They get all their donations from churches, civic organizations and scouting groups. None of them are meeting right now so that supply of food has been slowed to a trickle. And the number of people that they are servicing has increased.

What to do? At our VOMCA meeting I suggested we hold a food drive. No contact. Just let people know that we had a drop off point and that they could leave donations there and I would take them to the pantry. Little did I know how generous you would all be. I am thrilled. NCEON is thrilled. And all those people that you are helping are thrilled.

This is on-going. The box is on my porch at 8263 Mimico North. We all check it several times a day and bring in the food left and box it up and take photos so you can see what you all have done. Once a week, usually Friday, I go on my lunch

hour and drop it off. They are in need of cereal, peanut butter and jelly, canned fruits and vegetables, canned meats like tuna, spam, beef stew, spaghetti O's, pancake mix and syrup, pasta, and sauces, soups, canned milk, boxed milk, juice boxes, etc.

And they take donations of cash and checks made out to NCEON.
