

Happy Holiday's to all of Olde Mill. It's been a long, strange year and it is finally coming to an end. I am so proud of everything I've seen in this community.

Neighbors coming together to help each other, reaching out to take care of their neighbors, coming out for fresh



air and exercise, using the park and helping with our food drive and the new food pantry in the parking lot all make my heart swell with pride to be a part of this.

There are several things that are coming up that you need to know about. First the Tree Lighting is going to have to be modified for this year. The Governor has limited the number of people that can gather and with our virus numbers growing VOMCA has decided to cancel the activities associated with the tree lighting. However, the tree will be lit at the field on December 12th at 5 pm. We will sing some carols and we will light the tree. VOMCA, with your help, has turned in 85 boxes of food since May but it is not enough. I will continue to collect food on my porch at 8263 Mimico North and take it to NCEON in Glen Burnie. if you were planning to give food to Santa, why not drop it off here instead and I'll make sure it gets where it's supposed to go.

The road is finally repaved and I think it looks good. They are starting to work on the lane markings for Wade's Grant and I've spoken to Traffic Engineering and they have put in to apply for a traffic circle on our behalf to improve the intersection of Oakwood and Old Mill. Randal and I and several members of our community attended a meeting about the three new homes they are trying to build on Old Mill Rd. It is not too late to try to block this from happening and I am in contact with I & P to make sure they know how we feel about this. Welcome everyone to the 2020 HOLIDAY SEASON!

I know that sounds strange, but it has been a strange year. FOOM volunteers are still showing up and doing some maintenance and beautification of the park however we have no group days or large projects and events scheduled at the park for the rest of the year. If you would like to help, please contact me and I can show you some simple tasks we need done. In fact there are less than 12 volunteers who do 95% of the work at the park and we would love to meet some new people, if you are willing to clip, trim, paint, plant, build, or cook the hotdogs we can use you.

The concerns this year have affected our ability to hold events and to raise funds for the park, it has also limited the ability of our normal volunteers to get as much done at the park as we would like. We did finally hold the 2020 Barlowe Bolt this month just 7 months late but I want to thank everyone who worked the event and participated in it, we put in place significant procedures and devices to keep everyone socially distanced and protected so they could enjoy the event. We plan to hold the 2021 Barlowe Bolt on schedule on Saturday March 27th, race starts at 7am, come and join us, setup starts at 5am.

I would like to acknowledge the Lescallett family, they just moved out of our community to pursue an adventure in another state, but while they were here they chose to get involved and helped us create a new FOOM logo and Stephan was also leading an effort to rededicate the playground at Barlowe Field in the name of a member of his unit that had passed away. Like many things Covid delayed that effort however we want to try to move it forward and finish what Stephan started. Chris Szverra and I inspected a playground set up that the county is removing at Lock Haven park in Edgewater, it could use a coat of paint to freshen it up but it consists of a climbing and sliding assembly, a teeter-totter, a swing set similar to what we already have and have been looking to add to, plus 3 benches. We can take the whole thing at no charge but we have to remove it in about 30 days, this will require significant disassembly and pulling some posts out of the ground (with a piece of mechanical equipment) then we can store it until we can install all or selected parts into our park. We think it can be a great addition but will require a lot of volunteers on one day to do the work to remove it. I am looking for someone who might have access to a flatbed truck, and someone who might be able to supply and drive the power equipment. Stephan had started a go fund me page to obtain donations to cover expected costs of the project.

The meeting was called to order by Chris Szverra at 7:06.

The following guests were also present:

Old Business:

- 1. Election of Board Members 2021: The following VOMCA Executive Board members were approved for a three-year continuation unanimously by the quorum present:
 - a. Sarah Hakulin
- 2. VOMCA Treasures Report:
 - a. Checking \$749.81 Paid taxes of \$397.42 for a balance of \$352.39.
 - b. Savings: \$1591.37
- 3. Swim Club Treasurers Report:
 - a. Checking \$5,157.82
 - b. Savings \$543.47
 - c. 164 members: 92 Active, 76 Inactive
- 4. VOMCA Membership Report: No member dues paid yet for 2021
- 5. Minutes: Discussion, Review and Acceptance: Reviewed and passed unanimously
- 6. NCEON Food Drive Update:
 - a. Still going on. Currently requesting Thanksgiving-themed non-perishables for donation.
- 7. Food Pantry at Park: The Food Pantry is being put to good use. We are requesting anyone that is able to help us keep an eye on it and keep it stocked for those in need.
- 8. Tree Lighting Event: The Tree Lighting Event is scheduled for December 12. Currently the plan is to hold the event from 2-6 PM, with the tree lighting happening at the end of the event. We are still working out social distancing issues with having Santa Claus present and what activities we can hold at the event. (This event has been modified).

New Business:

- 1. Budgets for 2021:
 - a. VOMCA: Current budget is approved as posted.
 - b. OMSC: Pool Budget accepted as is with option to amend as new management contract is signed and approved. Still not clear how the situation will develop with the COVID situation. We are currently looking into other pool management companies for 2021.
- 2. Mews at Millersville: Pushing for the houses on Old Mill Road to not be built. There was a community meeting about the development, but there were no representatives from the county.
- 3. Tentative Calendar for 2021: Reviewed
- 4. Playground equipment/FOOM: We are anticipating a minimum of \$1,000 to rent equipment (backhoe, transport, etc) and storage facilities for the playground. (See Pictures)
- 5. Police Community Relations Meetings Resumed: No major issues to report from CPL McAdoo. First meeting was about 2 weeks ago
- 6. Membership Drive
- 7. Fundraisers: We are looking into ideas for fundraising events.
 - a. Ledos: We are looking into setting up a pickup/delivery fundraiser through Ledos. TBD
 - b. Polar Bea:r Plunge for Old Mill Swim Team: November 14 at 12:00. \$10 per person.

Meeting adjourned at 8:19 pm. Next meeting will be December 2, 7 pm, online. Link for the meeting will be posted.
