

VOMCA Meeting Minutes

Date: March 2, 2022

Place: Old Mill High School Cafeteria

Time: 7:05 PM

Special Guest:

Karen McJunkin – Elm Street Development: 4-story apartment building proposed on Granary Ct (off Old Mill Road). Property currently zone R-15; recently adopted development plan calls for it to re-zoned R-22. Rezoning would allow additional 84 units on existing property. Proposed location is not visible from Old Mill Road. No buildings would be torn down in the process; this would be an additional building in the existing apartment complex. Would still need to meet other zoning requirements (public schools, utilities, etc.) prior to construction. All units would meet handicap access requirements; a few would be fully accessible. Landscaping will be primarily native plants. The existing pool would be removed and a new pool installed in its location along with improved recreational (picnic tables, barbecue areas, club house) built on the property.

Several concerns (increased traffic issues, housing availability for seniors, removal of existing recreational facilities where the building will be constructed) were brought up and addressed.

First hearing on the application is Thursday, March 10th.

Hello everyone please hang with me while I do a quick rundown of the month of April out in our park

We had an Eagle Scout Candidate (Rob Martinazzi) bring an army of helpers with him and completely recreate the back memorial garden by the basketball court, new everything including plantings and a bench with dedications on it. Thank you Rob and Troop 975 (located at St Bernadette Parish in Severn)

We now have a youth soccer league practicing on our ballfields during the week... and

We have not just 1 but 2 women's softball teams practicing on the field... and

The men's softball league has returned for what may be their 100th year

The teams coordinated together and prepped the ballfield for the coming season and all that use it.

Meanwhile, the FOOM/VOMCA volunteers started the preparation for installing the playground equipment. Lots of marking was done, holes were bored and this Saturday 4/23 starting at 8am everyone is hopefully going to join us to assemble and install the equipment. If you are not available that day do not worry about it, you can come on 4/30 or 5/7 and help finish up, or help move mulch, it cannot open until a layer of mulch is in place to make it safe. This is a lot of work and so many volunteers are helping but a project like this requires as much help as possible, so if you are only going to volunteer to help at the park one day a year this is the time to do it. And if you are one of the hundreds of people that now enjoy the park, like they say on PBS your support is what makes it possible.

Some of the very active volunteers got together at the park a couple of weeks ago, and they removed the old rotting plywood on the playground end of the Snack Shack above the bricks and installed brand new sheets of wood and some trim, it looks great! As I said, something for any volunteer, we need to stain that wood, and we need to replace the trim and bug screens on each side of the shack.

I usually do not like to talk about the challenges we sometimes face at the park but sometimes we must. We had an incident this week, someone took a can of spray paint (a horrible brown) and sprayed nonsense on the shack and some of the wooden structures at the park. Yes, we are reporting it to the police, and yes, we are reporting it to our insurance company, but the best thing we can do is come together with a positive attitude and make it go away. We need to repaint one of those bright green doors, power wash and scrub some brick, and sand some boards, perhaps replace a few, please give me a shout if you are willing to lend a hand with the playground, with the park, or with the cleanup. The community is great, and I refuse to let one individual change my opinion.




