VOMCA President's Letter

Happy August, Olde Mill! This summer is flying by. The weather has been interesting, to say the least, and a lot of plans have been canceled or modified to accommodate Mother Nature. I hope you are enjoying your vacations and time off from school/work. We have a lot of activities coming up in our wonderful community, so let's take a look at what they are.

VOMCA/FOOM Meeting – August 2, 2023, 7 – 9 pm Wendy's: Join us as we discuss the rest of this year's community events, how we can make a difference to those who live here, and what is happening that will impact our community. Come on out, meet your neighbors, and see what we do to make Olde Mill a better place to live.

VOMCA Dues: Why not pay your annual membership dues while you're at it? We are a community association which means that dues are voluntary. We have 1300 homes in the Olde Mill Community; of those, we only have 81 members. The dues we collect go to fund the taxes on Barlowe Field. VOMCA owns this land; it is NOT County property. So, we pay taxes every year. It also supports our community events, like the Easter Egg Hunt and the Fall Fest. VOMCA also funds the annual Tree Lighting and Santa's visit on the fire tree. We donate to the Food Bank (NCEON) and the OMS Team. It's not too late to be a part of helping your community, and if you pay your dues, you can vote at the VOMCA meetings.

1st Annual Island Dinner – August 19th, 7 – 10 PM at OMSC:

We are very excited about this activity. We offer a night of good fun, great music, and excellent food. Plus, some exciting raffles. The cost is \$20.00 per person for pool members over 16 and \$30.00 for non-pool members over 16. 16 and under are \$10.00 per person regardless of membership. To Everyone who uses and appreciates Barlowe Field!

Hello to all the fans of Barlowe Field. This has become a bustling place with lots of people, families, and dogs enjoying themselves, the sports fields are full, and it looks like they will remain full until it snows, and then we will all go sledding.

The first item on my agenda is to say thank you! However, I need to figure out who to say thank you to. Someone planted two beautiful trees in the tree line along the Chalet sidewalk. However, no one knows who put them there. They are good trees and a quality installation, and we very much would like to know who to thank, so if you know, give us a call.

I want to remind everyone that anything good you see happening over there has been made possible by a small group of volunteers and lots of fundraising. We need some support from all of you to keep it going and reach some of our goals. **Saturday, September 23**, is our next **Community Day** at the park, starting at 7am, and we would like to stop at about 1pm; we can use all the help we can get to prepare for fall and winter in our gardens. Please get in touch with us if you believe you can participate so that we can plan the activities, and if you cannot yet commit, please show up that morning and jump right in.

We will focus on the northwest corner of the park, where the woods are. We want to restore the back Memorial Garden, retaining all the beautiful flowering plants placed there by the scouts and putting down a good weed barrier and fresh mulch. We want to clean up the basketball court by moving the remaining coarse mulch to the edges of the woods, and if you have a weedwhacker and pruning shears, bring them with you as we have a lot of vegetation that has grown up where we had cleared along the edge of the woods. We need to cut it back; warning there is some poison ivy there, so if you are sensitive to it, we would like you to work in some other areas; if you are brave and bold, jump in to help us get rid of it.

If you love the park and think it is worthwhile to support it but are not really a gardening type, we accept donations.

Also, please put our critical fall fundraiser for the park on your November calendar, our Quarter Auction on Saturday, 11/18, from 6 to 9pm.

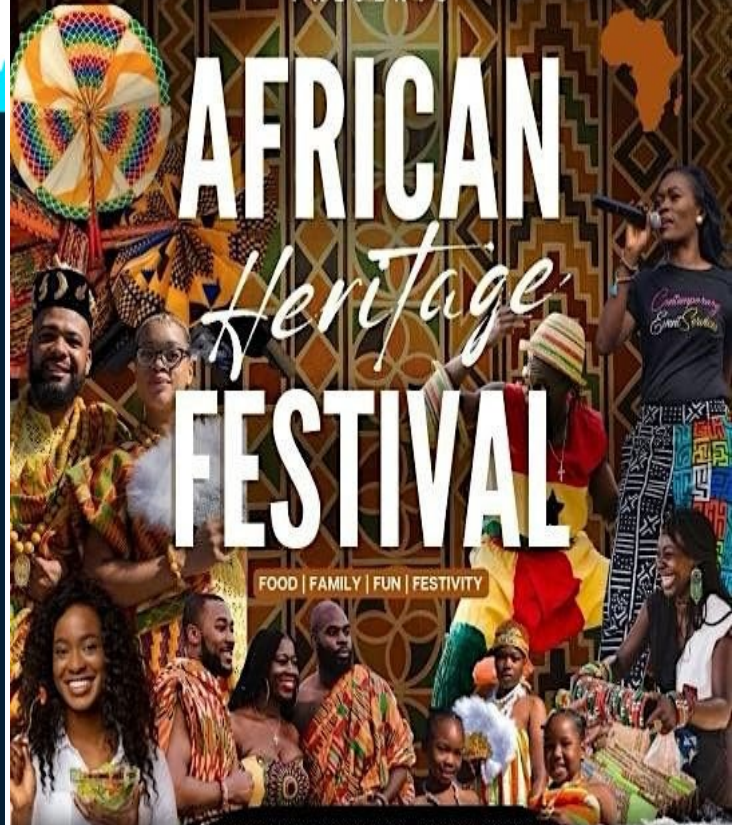
