

FOOM Update

We have been steadily working at 8am every Saturday morning to progressively get the playset assembly completed, we are sooo close! During August we will be shifting to preparing the playset area and installing the enclosure and the mulch. We had a very poor turnout on the recent community day, I think I am going to go back to calling it something else, held twice a year, spring to get the park ready for summer, and fall to get the park ready for winter. When we have a project to do, we will simply ask for help with the project. We have received many compliments regarding the improvements at the park, but we typically have about 5 people helping out, that is 5 out of almost 100 VOMCA member households out of 1,300 community homes and what we estimate to be 300 people a week who enjoy the use of Barlowe Field. If you are wondering if we need help, yes, we do. I expect to be at the playground at 8am every Saturday for the month of August, stop by or contact me at 202-441-1232 (text is best) or rstites@polingerco.com. We believe we are eligible for a grant from the Airport Authority that would allow us to repair or possibly replace the sidewalk at the park along Chalet, we need two things to try for this, first we need someone to volunteer to complete all the paperwork and guide our application through the process, second, we need to obtain three proposals from concrete companies to do the work. If you would like to volunteer to manage this project, or if you know of a good concrete contractor you think we should talk to, again please contact me.

Apparently, the basketball hoop we recently installed at the basketball court is missing. Can we have it back?


I have mentioned this previously, we would like to install a new set of poles and backboards, we need a fund-raising page of some sort as we do not currently have the funds. We want to ask for a volunteer to administer this item.

Also desired at the basketball court area, a pickleball court. Our understanding is that if we sink two poles into the existing asphalt, paint some lines, and get a net we are good to go. Is there anyone reading this that is knowledgeable of that sport who might want to administer this one?

If you have read to this point you may be thinking "wow that is a lot of work", it is but it is not only required but worthwhile for the condition and future of Barlowe Field. If you are not able to help with Saturday projects if you can just pick up trash, move fallen limbs, gather full trash bags and place them at the curb, all those small things can help a lot.
