

HAPPY HOLIDAYS OLDE MILL! Whether you celebrate Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, or none of these, I hope you have a joyous December and will spread the love and cheer throughout the community that we all live in. A lot is happening in Olde Mill this month, so let's look at what's coming up.

VOMCA/FOOM Meeting – December 6 from 7 – 9 pm at Hardee's: Join us to discuss the upcoming year and what we'd like to achieve in Olde Mill. You can vote on the 2024 budgets for VOMCA and OMSC. There will be a lot of discussions and some voting, and if you are so inclined, some food or dessert to partake of. So, put this on your calendar.

VOMCA Dues: It's time to pay your 2024 dues to belong to VOMCA.

Raising money for a new playground

To all who love our community

Another year is done, and a new one is about to begin.

I am excited for the new year. We have many opportunities and fun times just ahead of us. If you look at the VOMCA calendar, you will see our fundraisers, The Barlowe Bolt, and shortly after that, we will have a Flea Market and a Spring Planting day at Barlowe Field.

We are starting our planning for the 2024 Barlowe Bolt. If you have never joined us, you should. Runners and walkers are welcome; it takes place within our community; if you are a runner, you get a nice little goody bag that includes a shirt until they are all gone.

Register early, save some money, and be guaranteed a shirt in the size you choose. Every cent raised goes to improve the park. If you want to avoid running the 5K, walk the 1 mile; if you don't feel that energetic, come and volunteer with us. It is an excellent group of people and a fun activity, and while set up starts at 5 am (yawn), the run starts at 7 am and is over by 8 am. Yes, they are that quick. If you have someone you know involved in Old Mill athletics, challenge them to join us and bring their whole group along with them. Police and Fire can run for free.

We have been working hard to improve the park steadily. It is much slower than we would like. Still, in 2024, we aim to strengthen the enclosure around the mulch at the playground. We plan to substantially improve the asphalt activity area (currently called the basketball court). Here is an overview: remove that ugly pile of mulch, expand the paved area by about 10 feet along one side (towards the pool), black coat and seal the entire area, install a full-size basketball court next to the existing "practice" size one, and over where the mulch sits, we plan to put in a pickleball court, I already bought my wife pickleball paddles in anticipation of watching her play.

We are already planning our gardening work; this is my favorite thing to do at the park, and I plan to do much of it this year. Maintaining the existing gardens, improving a few, and watching the small trees gain another year of growth, some of them produce berries. I would love to have fruit trees, perhaps apple or pumpkin trees! By the way, we had two beautiful new trees show up along Chalet a few months back, and we have asked everyone we could find, but we still do not know who to thank for them. If you know, please thank them for us.

If any of this is helpful to you or interests you, then you are the person we need to meet. All of this only gets done with donations gathered from our FOOM events (see Barlowe Bolt above) and our other fundraisers and by volunteers.

The Proposed 2024 OMSC Budget was approved with minor corrections by all members present.






