

This edition of the Village Crier is all about a big effort to reach out to those in our community who may not currently be aware of what is occurring all around them in The Village of Olde Mill. All of us who volunteer for the communities' needs are constantly amazed that we hear comments like "I didn't know we had a park" or "Olde Mill has a pool?" or "I see you guys out there doing stuff but didn't really understand what was going on". This month we are not only sending out our Village Crier to the email list of VOMCA members and others who have signed up, but we are producing an old fashioned (somewhat condensed) version that we are going to distribute to every home in the community. We post on Facebook, Nextdoor, we have our own websites, we put up signs and banners continuously to try and get the word out so that everyone can enjoy and if desired join in. There are no clicks, no one is harassed, we do not chase power or anything else, in fact it is rare indeed that there is ever a conflict in any of the things we do, workdays, meetings, events, everyone just pitches in, and everyone is welcome. Still, we hear feedback that indicates we need to do a better job on outreach, and so we are trying. I hope these notes, this information is reaching a few people perhaps who have not seen it all before but here are some of the things that Friends of Olde Mill (FOOM) has been working on in the recent past and will be soon.

Gardens – we love gardens and every year we try to clean them up and improve them, we always need people who love plants, young or old, everyone can take pride in something beautiful

Trees – Anything you read these days is likely to reference the environment and many of you recognize that development and trees do not always go together, we have our patch of woods at Barlowe Field, it takes TLC to keep it green, and along with the counties Watershed Stewardship Academy we are planting new trees around our park, in just a few weeks a variety of 50 new ones will be installed

The Playground – a highlight of Barlowe Field, many dedicated volunteers have managed, improved, and renovated the playground to try and keep it fresh, and fun. For the past decade we have approached it with a green, natural approach for our young and not so young community members. Even though we just added a metal swingset and are about to add a climbing/sliding assembly we are still working to make the area as natural looking as we can, the new paint that will go on the equipment once it is installed will be various greens to reflect our belief that this is a healthy approach.

Events - we love events, and anyone who has attended any of our events, there is fun, laughter, music, and food at most of them. Yes, we must raise money for the park, after all we are wholly community owned and maintained, there are no grants, taxes, or other source of income to allow us to do what we do, but who says fundraising must be dull and boring?

So come out, stop by, if you want to lend a hand, please feel free to do that, if you just want to see what is going on, we would love to talk with you, if you have ideas, we need them, and if you have talent or expertise we can use it, but will promise not to exploit it.

We love our community; we think it is exceptional and part of what makes it that way are the people who choose to live here. Come out for the first time, or come out again, you will have a wonderful day.


