We've had some very exciting community happenings this past month. The Pool held a very successful car wash. We washed a big wheeler and several trucks. And I sold lots of yummy baked goods. After we cleaned up from this, we rushed to the OMSC pool and set up for our first annual Ice-Cream Social. It was open to the community. 1. VOMCA Treasurer's Report:

5. Minutes from May Meeting were reviewed and approved by all members present.
6. Swim Team Work Day Update 5/13/23: Went well. The deck and chairs were pressure washed. Wading pool was cleaned out.
7. Pool Opening Update: So far Ace Aquatics crew this year seems to be an improvement from last year's crew.
8. Ice Cream Social Date & Plans: Social will be June 17 from 7-9pm. Pool members and paid guests from that day may stay after the regular pool closing at 7pm. Non-pool members can come in for Social and swimming for \$10 (standard guest fee). Ice cream and toppings will be served/controlled by VOMCA/OMSC board members.
9. Vending Machine Update: Currently there is an issue with the vending machines, so that is still TBD.
10. Car Wash Update & Next Car Wash Date: June 17th from 8am to 2pm. We are requesting donations of baked goods to sell at the event as well. This will be a fundraiser
11. 4th of July: Planning the same festivities as usual. Grilling hot dogs/hamburgers and the snack shack will be open. Potentially will have the "unofficial" fireworks show from the softball field.
12. August 19th Island Dinner: All participants (members and not) will need to pay the admission fee for the event since it will include higher cost items than the other events. The event will be a fundraiser event for the pool.

FOOM BUSINESS:

1. Snack Shack/Storage Area Work Day: TBD
 - a. Need to refigure the storage to make it more accessible to everyone.

2. Spring Flea Market Update 5/20/23: We made about \$280 on the event. The event was primarily run that day by Jessica and Josiah.
3. Playground Update:
 - a. We still need to add more mulch to the playground box and put in improved timbers around the playground area. Estimated cost for that improvement is approximately \$5,000.
 - b. We may cover up the existing sandbox area with a wooden deck for a picnic table and relocate the sandbox to another area (potentially adjacent to the new deck).
 - c. We would like to add a border to the volleyball court area to help control the grass encroachment.
4. Grant Money from State: Randal Stites and Chris Szverra are working through the process to receive the grant money (\$25,000) from the state to make improvements.

The **State Tax Sale Ombudsman's Office** helps homeowners **understand** the tax sale process and **connect** with tax credits, counseling, and other resources to help them pay their taxes and keep their homes.

It also administers the **Homeowner Protection Program (HPP)**, which can provide **homeowners in tax sale** a repayment plan, a custom assistance strategy, and ongoing communications and support.

96% of homeowners contacted for follow up in 2022 successfully avoided tax sale the year after our office helped them.

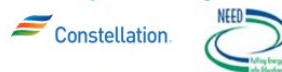

MyCoast is a flooding community science app and website. It provides a space to capture and analyze flooding photos.

It categorizes flooding into high tide, precipitation, and storm damage.

How to use it?



Take your picture via our mobile app or submit it via your browser.

Our servers retrieve weather and tide information to add context to your photo.



Local jurisdictions can use data to better meet community needs.

Why use it?

MyCoast allows everyone to contribute pictures of flooding anywhere in the state of Maryland! This provides opportunities for recording data in otherwise inaccessible areas. The photos are also linked to tidal and weather information allowing governments and scientists to better understand why the flooding occurred. This app enhances awareness and encourage action to reduce flood risks.
