

Friends of Olde Mill Invite you to Barlowe Field

To All Friends of Olde Mill,

Welcome to summer and June, the pool, and lots of growth at Barlowe Field. I have been trying to finish the mulch laying for a couple of months and have made progress, but I have yet to finish it. I want to highlight a concern; those of us involved in FOOM and VOMCA feel we are seeing steady improvement at the park; we see growing numbers of people out enjoying the facilities or just being outside.

The park is very busy with youth soccer practice, girls' softball practice, the men's Sunday softball games, the playground is filled with the sights and sounds of kids having fun, the basketball court is busier than ever, oh yes, and the pool is now open! Whew, that is a lot, and it is all wonderful.

However, we could use your help. The physical work, paperwork, ideas, and energy of our group of volunteers drive all of this, and it is a limited amount. I want to ask you to consider helping for 1 to 2 hours a month; it can be general, such as picking up trash, or more specific, like caring for a specific garden or replacing a board or two at the playground.

It would really mean a lot, and I am happy to give specifics, guidance, and help. Don't hesitate to contact me at rstites@polingerco.com to talk about it and add your name to our growing list of volunteers

And since I am a glutton for punishment, I would also like to hear your compliments, complaints, ideas, and recommendations. We do our best, but we appreciate input to help us do better.

If you have walked near the basketball court recently, you may have seen some things that made you turn your head.

A large pile of course mulch was donated to us for free but was way more than we could utilize; it is free and available. You can have a little or a lot; it would be appreciated if you give us a heads-up that you want some so we can keep a handle on things.

A large pile of dirt and an ugly drainage ditch – we had some equipment available while the water main was being repaired, and we did our best to use it to recreate the drainage ditch that is supposed to run along the side of the basketball court, we got a lot of it done, but the detail work is still unfinished. We need to rake a lot, shovel a little and smooth out the ditch so it flows toward the parking lot. Then we will seed it.

Large bald spot on the grass next to the parking lot – this is where the water main repair occurred, and we need to do a little clean up, move away rocks and clay chunks, add a little dirt to the low spots, stir it all up and add grass seed.

It is essential to prioritize the maintenance of Barlowe Field, which relies heavily on community support. With the closure of Southgate Park and the construction of a new school, this responsibility has become increasingly challenging. Let us work together to ensure the upkeep of this valuable community space.

There were a lot of complaints from community members that they did not receive notice that the school was being built at Southgate Park. Concerns were addressed about Old Mill Road (at Oakwood) being opened up for bus traffic to the school. There will be an update meeting in June regarding the road situation.
- 7. Car Wash Fundraiser Update: We raised \$618 at the car wash through donations and food sales. We plan to hold another car wash in June, date TBD.
- 8. Easter Egg Hunt Update: Event was a success. All candy was given out. We are planning changes for the following year. We will add craft activities next year followed by the egg hunt.
- 9. Swim Team Work Day 5/13/2023: We will be working on getting the pool ready to go for the upcoming season. Work includes power washing the chairs and deck and cleaning out the pool restrooms. We also need to clean out the pool filters for this season.
- 10. Vending Machine: We have limited information regarding this opportunity, but so far the consensus is that we are going to decline it.

FOOM BUSINESS:

- 1. Financial Report:
 - a. Checking: Approximately \$3,500.
- 2. Community Work Day 5/13/2023: We will be doing multiple projects around the park.
- 3. Snack Shack/Storage Area Work Day: We need to organize the storage area and attic space. Date TBD.
- 4. Spring Flea Market 5/20/2023: We've sold 16 spaces as of 5/3/2023. We will need help with set-up and clean-up.
- 5. Playground Update: We added more mulch to the playground area under the swing area. We will be adding more mulch at a later date around the slides.
- 6. Basketball Court: The basketball court needs to be resurfaced and the cracks sealed. We are looking at proposals to have the basketball court surface expanded and new backboards/poles added.

The Community Police Academy provides Anne Arundel County residents, 21 years of age and older, an opportunity to learn about laws, police procedures, forensics, crime scene collections, resource management and more. Participants are provided an opportunity to demonstrate what they have learned through some hands-on practical applications. You'll learn self-defense, arrest techniques, vehicle maneuvers, as well as learn about many other areas of the Police Department. You will also learn about how to improve the quality of life in your community by partnering with the police department.

The goal of the Anne Arundel County Police Community Police Academy is to build bridges between the communities we serve and their police department. We do this by offering an opportunity to gain a better understanding of the department and to develop a relationship with the community members through education and training. Chief Amal Awad and members of the Anne Arundel County Police Department believe the best way to protect yourself is through knowledge.

Community members are invited to come to various Anne Arundel County Police Department facilities to learn first-hand what a police officer does and why they do those things. 
