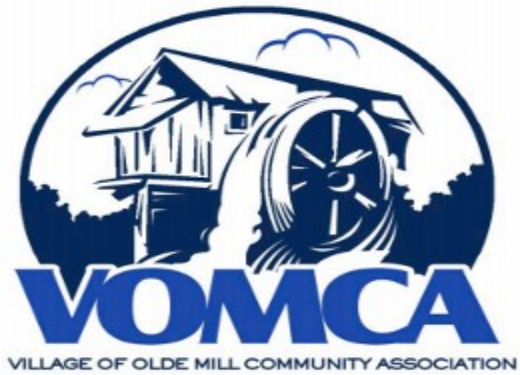

HAPPY THANKSGIVING OLDE MILL! Check out the photos from the Fall Fest. It was a great time, and we survived the wind. We are coming up on our holiday season, and we will once again have our annual tree lighting, complete with a brand new tree and our visit from Santa and his friends on the fire truck. Don't forget to leave us canned goods for our local food bank. And our next big event is our Quarter Auction, to be held at Christ Lutheran Church on Jumpers Hole Rd. Please see the flyer in this issue. It's a great cause and so much fun—plan on coming out and joining us.

There are still a lot of great events coming up in our community, so let's see what we have planned.

VOMCA/FOOM Meeting – November 1st, 2023: 7 – 9 pm Hardees: Join us as we discuss the rest of this year's community events, how we can make a difference to those who live here, and what is happening that will impact our community. Supporting the OMSC: As most know, the pool is in very bad financial shape. The cost of life-guards and chemicals is increasing, and we have tried to balance that with our pricing. Still, we need to bring in more money to cover the cost of our management company. We have several fundraisers going. There is a GoFundMe page set up, and the flyer for that is in the newsletter if you'd like to contribute. We have had several fundraisers and are working on more, so keep your eye out for ways you can help us save the OMSC. Remember, the park is also part of the OMSC. If we lose one, we lose them both. My priority right now is our Holiday Tree. We utilized the existing tree for three years, and suddenly, one day, it was completely dead. We have no idea why, but I would ask all of you who use the park to keep an eye on all of our trees and plantings and report if you see something strange occurring, and if you see anyone abusing our plantings, take a picture and ask them to stop.

So, we turned this tragedy into an opportunity. We just bought a new, bigger holiday tree to plant at the park. That is much work, and we need your help, but if you want to come and get some for your muddy patch in your backyard, please do. We can only install our pickleball court once it is out of the way.

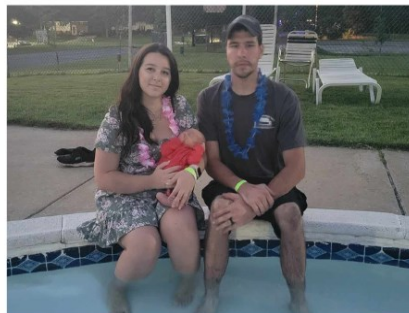

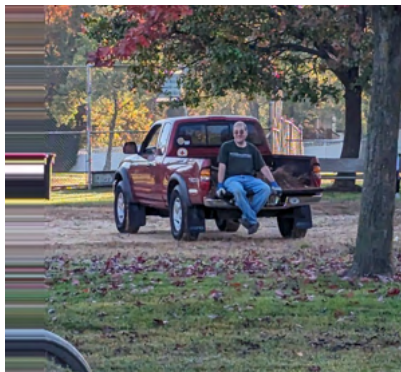

Glen Burnie Town Center Street Lighting Upgrade

October 2023

This flier is being sent to inform you that some of the street lighting in the Glen Burnie Town Center will be upgraded starting in early November 2023. Anne Arundel County has been working with other agencies and is now in the final phase of this process to have outdated street lighting replaced. The area of work is identified in the map below.

Our office, the Traffic Engineering Division (TED), will work with BGE, MDOT and contractors to have new street light fixtures and black decorative poles installed. We hope to have this work completed by the end of the year, barring any weather delays or material/supply issues.

While we understand that this work may impact parking and cause disruption to sidewalks, we believe the results of this temporary inconvenience are beneficial to the beautification efforts for the Glen Burnie Town Center. Please note the parking disruption will be constrained to 50 feet near each street light and only for the day(s) necessary for work at each street light.

Please note that free parking is available at the Henry L. Hein Public Service Building located at 7480 Baltimore Annapolis Blvd. Another free parking lot can be accessed at Central Ave and Platzer Ln NW. These parking areas are noted on the map with purple stars.

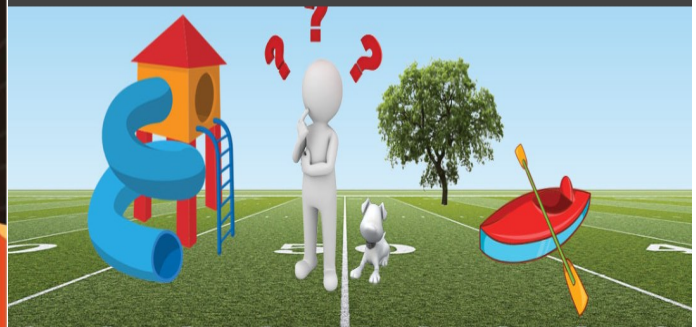
